

The new Mayor is Councillor Jan Weeks. Her nominated charity is the British Heart Foundation. The new Deputy Mayor is Councillor Jim Edwards.

We consider ourselves fortunate to be living in a community minded Valleys town with such a varied history, especially its key role in the Chartist movement in South East Wales.

Blackwood was crucial to Chartism, which saw rallies across Britain ignored by Parliament. Violence broke out and on November 4th 1839, the Newport Rising was born, planned at the Coach & Horses pub in the town. Zephaniah Williams led a column from Blackwood which marched on the Westgate Hotel in Newport, where bloodshed ensued with more than 200 Chartists arrested and their leaders, including Williams transported for life to Tasmania. The Chartists' failure was relatively short lived, as many of their demands were adopted by 1918, forming the basis of the current UK electoral system.

Our town's historic role in the Chartist movement was commemorated in the form of a statue at the end of 2008 – the 180th anniversary of the workers' fight for political and social reform. The 25ft. steel man, with pike in hand, looking towards Newport with his back to Oakdale Colliery stands on the roundabout at the end of the Chartist Bridge at the northern end of town.

Town Council levy a precept each year, and provide the Hanging Baskets and Christmas Lighting/
Decorations on the High Street, organise and sponsor the very popular Town Carnival, Christmas Lantern Parade and Carol Concert and fund grants to charitable organisations and local groups.

The Council also sponsors a Blackwood in Bloom competition, which encourages people to

make the most of their front gardens and also recognises those local individuals who have made a contribution to the well being of the Town, by presenting them with a Civic Award.

More recently, the Council has become the Title Sponsor of the Velvet Coalmine Children's Literature Festival.

Town Council is consulted on Planning and other matters affecting the town, and work closely with Caerphilly Borough Council, the Police and other multi agency groups on the Town Centre Management, Retail Partnership, After Hours and Bus Station Groups to try and ensure the towns interests, safety and needs are reflected and met.

Blackwood is twinned with Protivin, a small town in the district of Pisek in the South Bohemian region of the Czech Republic, and this is recognised by the Torc Gateway sign opposite the library – a Blackwood Entrance sign depicting oak trees/wood from which our town derived its name, and plane trees native to the Protivin area.

The Town Council, together with the newly established Blackwood & District Heritage Association are determined that Coed Duon, a small remnant of the original wood that gave our town its name, remains a valuable asset for the local community for generations to come, and that the towns historic role in the Chartist movement is never forgotten.

Working with local groups and schools will ensure future generations are aware of our rich and varied heritage.

Gwent Children's **Diabetes Fund**

Gwent Children's Diabetes Fund is the charity fund run by the Paediatric Diabetes Team at Aneurin Bevan University Health Board. Any money raised is used directly for children with diabetes in Gwent.

Each year we undertake a number of activities to help improve the quality of life of children living with diabetes. Some of the events organised include:

Activity Day

This fun and action packed day is open to all children with diabetes aged between 8 and 13. It will include activities such as canoeing, climbing and gorge walking which are all supervised by qualified instructors. The feedback from previous activity days has been extremely positive and children have reported increased independence and confidence as a result of attending.

Transition day

Moving from primary school to secondary school can be a big change for any child. However having a chronic condition can make it even harder. Each year the team organise a transition day for all young people about to start in Secondary school. This day helps the children learn how they can manage their

diabetes in and around school. They get the chance to make friends with young people who have diabetes and are in a similar position. It includes team building activities and workshops, and the children are reassured that their diabetes can be managed efficiently in the school environment.

Education Club

Diabetes education club is run over 6 weeks where children are educated more about their diabetes. Each week the children are taught about a certain aspect of diabetes. They stay for an evening meal so they can put the knowledge they have learnt into practice.


Christmas Party

At Christmas time we arrange a party for the younger children. This event is really beneficial to the parents as they get to meet other parents with young children who suffer from the same condition. The children really enjoy themselves and meet new friends and meet Santa which the highlight of the party.






Top among these for younger readers are tales of dragons, football-playing vampires, a grumpy ghost and a very clever, very naughty monkey called Thimble – just some of the characters you'll meet in



our Dragonfly series for Years 2 to 5. And for older primary school readers and first year high school we have some brilliant tales. Take, for example, Scrambled by Huw Davies, a story of

boys, bikes and art classes – and some not-sohard bullies. Hero, Davidde, always hands in his homework on time and is a model pupil, but that doesn't stop him getting in trouble with the barmy new headmaster. So when he gets the chance to buy a scrambling bike instead of a telescope with his hard-earned savings, he does! Or there's Aubrey,





a rambunctious child who tries to run before he can walk and has crashed two cars before he's old enough to drive one. But when his dad's in trouble with a monster you cannot kill, Aubrey

sets of to the rescue, helped just a little by the fact that he can talk to animals! Or if these don't appeal we have stories set everywhere from the dark streets of Victorian Cardiff to the red prairies of Mars!

We think these are great reads, but you don't have to take our word for it. The first Aubrey book by Horatio Clare, Aubrey and the Terrible Yoot, won the Branford Boase Award for the best first children's novel in the UK in 2016. And the sequel, Aubrey and the Terrible Ladybirds – out in May, was a Sunday Times children's book of the week! Scrambled, set in a fictional valley's town was shortlisted for



the junior fiction
prize in the Heart of
Hawick Children's
Book Awards on the
Scottish borders.
And most recently
Thimble Monkey
Superstar by Jon
Blake – the one
about the monkey –

has been shortlisted in the UK's biggest funny books prize, the Lollies Laugh Out Loud Awards, in the 6-8 year old category. Children across Britain will have the chance to vote for Thimble in the awards right

up until December, with the winner announced in January 18. (Vote Thimble! shop.scholastic.co.uk/ lollies/popjam)

For teenage readers we have more: Sarah Govett's The Territory series sees 15-year-old Noah, Jack and Raf, have to take an exam which, if you fail, means almost certain death because you'll be thrown out of the safe but tiny Territory, into the lethal Wetlands outside the fence. Maria Grace's heroine, Emmeline, in White Petals is negotiating difficulties at home and in a south Wales care home, to emerge triumphant against the school bullies, with a little help from her friends. Past meets the present in the Carnegie-nominated The Boy Who Drew the Future by Rhian Ivory, or there are some Virtual Reality nightmares in Purge, by Kat Ellis for 16-19 year olds.




So from Newport, Gwent, (where Steve meets singing pirates) to Snowdonia (where Harri's pet dragon called Tan loves eating chocolate), from Llanidloes (that's the vampires) to Pembrokeshire (a magical island and a very odd granny) we have stories to delight children across the UK, and the world. 

What does it mean to you to come back and perform in Blackwood?

We're very happy that we've been asked to play Velvet Coalmine, it' great that Blackwood gets its own festival. It's always fun playing to a home crowd and the Methodist Church is a great venue so we're really looking forward to playing.

Who have been your musical influences?

Our influences vary but mainly stems from singer/songwriters such as Ray Lamontagne, John Mayer and Ryan Adams. We also spend a lot of time listening to music from the 60s and 70s such as Otis Redding, Al Green and Wilson Picket.

What has life been like after The Voice?

Life after The Voice has been very positive for us, we managed to sell out a UK Tour off the back of being part of the show and our music now reaches a much wider audience. We're also looking forward to supporting Tom Jones this summer on a run of dates which wouldn't have been possible without taking part of the show.

What piece of advice would you give aspiring musicians?

Our only advice is to play as many shows as you can, the more people you play in front of can only help you, and to spend a lot of time writing and focusing on what sort of band you wish to become.

What's your favourite thing about Blackwood?

I guess our favourite thing about Blackwood is the community and familiar friendly faces that we know after living here for a long time. Our hometown have been incredibly supportive of us since before appearing on The Voice and have continued their support.

Blackwood, Libanus, Pengam, Cefn Fforest, Fleur-de-lis, Markham and Ysgol Bro Sannan






